Dear parents and carers,

Welcome back to the start of Term 2. We hope you have had a good half-term break and an opportunity to spend time together as a family.

Your children have returned refreshed, ready for a new term and have embraced their learning with their usual gusto. Thank you for all you do to ensure your children arrive at school every day, ready to learn, we are very grateful for this and know this is a key part of our success as a school community.

Covid Health and Safety reminders.

Please wear masks at drop off and pick up and continue to wear them until you are away from the larger number of parents. We do have families who have vulnerable family members and the masks help protect others.

Please do not drop off forgotten items for children at the office. We have vulnerable members of staff and forgotten items have to pass through the office and then be delivered to classrooms. A timetable with what is needed each day for the children to tick off gets everyone into habits useful for every stage of their education. A child in Yr5 created a good example your child could design too. – link

Please stick to only 1 parent or carer picking up your children if possible. We still need to keep the number of adults collecting to a minimum.

Windows are open in all classrooms throughout the day. The heating is on to keep the room temperatures at acceptable levels but it is not as warm as usual. Please ensure your children are dressed with removable layers on. Plain navy or pale blue fleeces or gilets are perfect additions.

Children walking home alone

Please ensure that if your child walks home alone, you are confident that they would be able to manage an unpredictable situation. As a school we can only advise what arrangements you put in place after school for your children. However, your child does need a certain level of maturity to be able to know what to do if something untoward happens on the way home, such as being approached by a stranger. Please bear this in mind when your child is very persuasive about wanting to walk home alone.

Remote education

As I said in my letter before half term we do not want our schools to close, we believe it is essential for all our children to be in school and we will remain open unless the government directs us otherwise.

Thank you to everyone who completed the essential critical worker survey. You do not need to inform us at the moment if your shift pattern changes as we will confirm this with you should we go into full lockdown.

Thank you to everyone who responded with regards to the information regarding devices your children have access to at home and Wi-Fi/internet access should they need to be learning remotely at home. Our remote education policy has been drafted to outline expectations in the event of lockdown and can be viewed here.

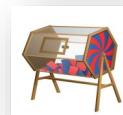

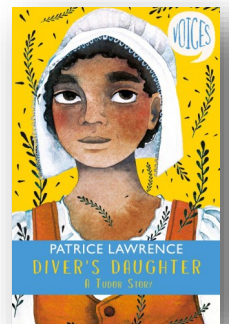
Year 3 Team
