

### Zero Tech Day

On Thursday 22nd April, across the trust, we ran our Zero Tech Day alongside Earth Day. The day was proposed by two Year 6 pupils who raised concerns about screen addiction and the impact of energy wastage on the planet.

The tech-free day meant that classes started with a traditional paper register, rather than using the usual computer system. Then, pupils took a creative approach to learning without interactive whiteboards.

Worksheets were also off limits as the computers and printers were turned off for the day. Teachers even turned off their emails during school hours, and pledged not to use their mobile phones during breaks.

The children learnt about the environmental benefits of switching off electrical equipment, and also talked about the social and emotional benefits of spending more time away from screens.

Earth Day started in 1970, and is a day to focus on creating a more sustainable environment to protect future of the planet. This includes preventing climate change and pollution, and protecting wildlife.



### Charity hair cut by Elmlea pupil



A little while back Eleanor (4B) decided to have her hair cut to donate to a charity that makes wigs for children with cancer Last week. Eleanor had her haircut in the garden (by Emmie's Mum). She had managed to grow her hair long enough for 15 inches to be donated to the Little Princess Trust who provide real hair wigs for children and young people who lose their hair due to cancer and other illnesses. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children to meet an international Olympian. The money raised will be used to regenerate the outside area as well as supporting athletes in a variety of sports from grass roots level through to Olympic level.

The children will have the opportunity to take part in a simple fun fitness circuit (for which they will be sponsored) which will include the following exercises:

- Sit ups (KS2) or Spotty Dogs (KS1)
- Leg drive
- Press ups
- Star jumps

The morning is all about fun, enjoyment and participation, with all children from Reception to Year 2 taking part, regardless of whether they collect sponsors or not. After the event the children will have the opportunity to ask Jason some questions, so that they can learn more about the sport and be inspired by their guest.

Our pupils have already seen a video from TSS, telling them all about their special guest and what will happen on the day. They were also told about seeking sponsorship safely with the help from family and friends and it was emphasised that strangers should never be approached. Here is an [online sponsorship page](#). You can also view what the school is raising money for, what the school target is and how much we have raised in total.

There are 'incentives' given for raising certain amounts of money: £7.50 - £12.49 = wristband, £12.50 - £19.99 = wrist band and drawstring bag, £20+ = wristband, drawstring bag and medal

How you can help at home:



Encourage your child to support you when sharing out things at home, this could be when making snacks for example and would reinforce our learning about sharing.







Strangely, a book had appeared in each classroom called The Iron Man. Had he really come to visit Elmlea?





