Sports Premium in Elmlea Infant School 2020-2021

The Government has given every primary school funding to develop physical education and competitive sport. This funding is intended for the purposes of establishing and developing sports activities which are sustainable in the long term. Following from the Covid-19 pandemic Government allowed the use of unspent funds from Sport Premium during the academic year 2019-2020 to be carried forward within 2020-2021. Elmlea Infants' have £10,145.00 unspent from the Sport Premium funding during 2019-2020. The school will receive £17,800 of Sports Premium funding for 2020-2021, in our school we are using this funding to provide:

Teachers will gain CPD while children take part in lessons. To inspire children to be active and aim high in their sporting achievements, organise Team Super Schools to visit and engage with all children.	£540	Children will be involved in an active exercise session with the Olympian visitor and have a talk where they can ask questions.
