Contact tracing and Class Bubbles

Any positive cases reported to school from the 19th July will not require a class bubble to self isolate.

If a child tests positive, they and their family will be required to self-isolate. Test and Trace may ask questions about the child in terms of who may have had prolonged contact with, a friend for a sleepover etc but will not require the whole class to self-isolate.

Up to midnight on Sunday 18th July any reported positive tests to school via the covid updates email over the weekend would require a class to self-isolate. If reported to school on Monday this would not be the case.

Year 6




Guitar Club



Year 3


