Quick reminders: Please remember that with the change in weather your child needs to bring a coat everyday and only water please in drinks bottles.

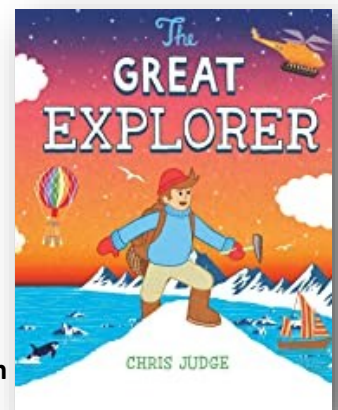

Year 2

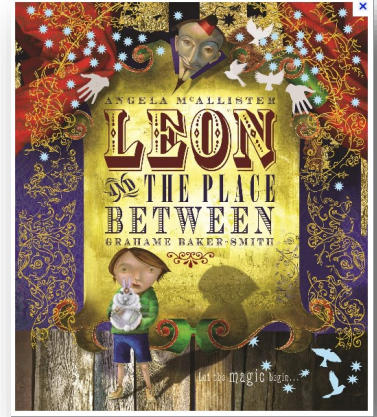

This has been a really good week of learning in Year 3. In English, the children have thoroughly enjoyed our new text, 'Leon and the Place Between,' which is a narrative all about the circus and magic. The children have been learning and using their knowledge of grammar to create increasingly detailed descriptive sentences. In maths, we have been using our knowledge of partitioning to add and subtract mentally. Friction has been our topic in science and the children loved testing out the grips of their shoes on different surfaces to see how much friction was created. In Year 4, we enjoyed getting to visit the library for this first time this week and exploring the books available.

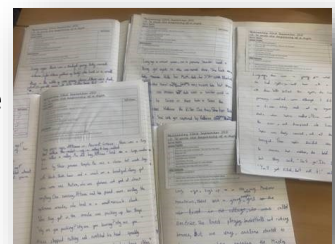
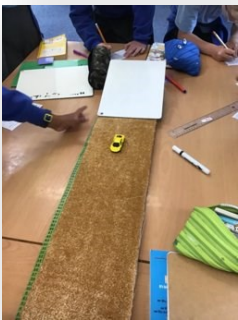

This week, Year 5 have been busy investigating Friction in Science by testing the stopping distances of toy cars on different surfaces. In Maths, we have been revisiting written methods of addition and subtraction; Our PSHE lessons have had us thinking about the UN Convention on the Rights of a Child; In English, we have brought together all our planning and learning around Greek Myths and created our own beautiful stories inspired by the story of Perseus. Focusing on figurative language and descriptive detailing, the children have imagined a rich world of heroes and monsters. Having carefully edited them, we are publishing them with pride this week for our class books.

After a few weeks of planning, designing and preparation, Year 6 finally got to scratch away their Ancient Greek inspired sgraffito pot design this week. They loved our practical demonstration of how the digestive system works in Science and used the knowledge gained to explain how humans absorb nutrients and water into the blood stream from the food we ingest through the process of digestion. They also discovered how this process links to the circulatory system. In History this week, we found out about some of the achievements of the Ancient Greeks and how they influenced the western world focussing on how the Ancient Greeks used trade to build their empire. A special well done to the Year 6s who have already completed some of the optional homework tasks to a high standard.
