### Sports Premium in our School 2022-2023

The Government has given every primary school funding to develop physical education and competitive sport. This funding is intended for the purposes of establishing and developing sports activities which are sustainable in the long term. The school will receive £19,610 of Sports Premium funding for 2022-2023, in our school we are using this funding to provide:
