

This week in Year One we have been learning to innovate stories, learning how we can change and adapt them to make them our own. Can your child could tell you which famous and

popular children's story we've read this week, and how they plan to change it? It involved a large, stripy carnivore that surprisingly arrives at a young girl's house, looking for snacks. We've planned to swap this



animal for another carnivore, one that has been extinct for millions of years. Can your child help you work out what it is by describing it to you using adjectives and similes? We have also continued to introduce division and have practised solving division calculations and word problems by sharing objects fairly between groups, as well as using our times tables to help us. A huge well done to 1C for performing your Class Assembly this week - you were amazing! Lastly, please remember to always bring a coat to school each day!

In Year 2 this week children have been continuing to learn about features of a diary and

have taken part in hot seating to imagine how people might have felt when the fire started spreading. In maths we have been investigating measure in cm and m. Children have been ordering lengths and using addition and subtraction to solve problems. Using our sketching skills, we sketched spring flowers in art and added tone and texture to make them look realistic. Our science topic has continued and we have been exploring materials and discussing their properties. During golden



time, children were given the opportunity to mix with the other classes in their year in preparation for their transition to the Junior School.

Year 3

In Year 3 this week we have been creating our own creatures to write instructions about. This work is a continuation of the instructions we have been writing for the creature 'Fenir' in the text 'Arthur and the Golden Rope' and will be published in our Writing progress books. We look forward to sharing our creatures and creative

instructions with our Year 6 buddies next week. In Maths we have been looking at angles/ amounts of turns. We have learned about right, acute, obtuse and reflex angles and applied our knowledge using compass directions. In Science, we conducted a fair test to see which of the different types of magnets we had in our classroom were the strongest.


volcanoes as their writing progress pieces. In maths, pupils have
