I hope you were able to enjoy the half-term break and enjoy time together as a family. The weather was also a real bonus and many of the children have talked about the outdoor activities they have enjoyed.

Yr 6 Camp

Yr6 have travelled to Dorset on Wednesday for their residential trip and have sent back reports of the fun they are having. We are very grateful to the staff team who have travelled with them to give them this opportunity, the memories of which will stay with them for a lifetime.

Changes to our transition arrangements

As a Trust we regularly review our transition arrangements between all year groups and have been aware that the transition between Yr2 and yr3 is the biggest jump the children make. We also listen to parent and staff feedback about transition and a recurring theme has been that if the children could stay in the same class grouping from Yr2 to Yr 3 this would reduce the impact of the move too. Consequently, we have made the decision to restructure classes from Year 1 to Year 2 starting from this year and ongoing.

Our current Yr2 children will still be changing class groupings, as this has been planned but from September 2023 Yr2 won't be changing classes when they move into Yr3.

We believe this is a really positive step forward for supporting our children to move to the Junior School and aid the transition process.

New classes

All parents and children will be informed on Monday about their child's new class teacher. Year groups have then planned shared activities when children will spend time in their new groupings to get to know each other and start to make new friends.

On Thursday the children will have their first of two shuffle up sessions when they will meet and spend time with their new teachers as well as spend time in their new classroom.

Further activities will be planned and we know from experience the children are ready for their new September class by the end of term.

At Elmlea we are used to the process of changing class groupings to ensure the move for your child will be positive. A lot of time and thought has gone into the decisions as to which class your child should go into with many factors, including friendships, gender balance, needs of the child etc considered for 90 children. Please note the classes have been set and your child cannot change classes.










This term has a focus on transition for Reception. We are starting to talk to the children about moving to Year 1, the fun that it brings and the new experiences and feelings they might start to feel.

We will be posting our transition activities to Tapestry so keep a look out so that you can continue the positive discussions at home.



classrooms into rows. But no computer games or iPads! Shocking!




Year 1 Team


