Dear parents and carers,

We are sending our newsletter out early this week as we have our staff training day tomorrow.

Enrichment Activities - Yr3 and Yr4 had the opportunity this week to visit the Sri Guru Singh Sabah Gurdwara temple to enrich their studies of Sikhism as part of their religion and world views curriculum. The children found the visit really interesting and brought their previous learning in the classroom to life. Our Reception classes visited Court Farm on Tuesday and had such an enjoyable time and impressed everyone with their fabulous behaviour on such an exciting trip.

Our Junior Orchestra also travelled to Trinity Academy this week to take part in a workshop to create a very large ensemble orchestra, playing together with other children from across Bristol, which was a real privilege.

Thank you so much to our many volunteers who travelled with the children on our trips, without your support the trips cannot take place and your time is much appreciated. Thank you also to all our teachers and the admin team who make the trips happen.

Community - a parent shared with me this week how grateful they were to our parent community for finding her handbag which had dropped out in the road on the way to school and for the parents who found it and returned it via other parents to her. She said it really made her feel how kind and supportive the parent community were and wanted to thank everyone whoever you are for your kindness.

Strike dates - we have been informed by the National Education Union that teachers will be striking on the 5th and 7th July. This means that the schools will be closed to all children, apart from our vulnerable children and those whose parents are working for the emergency services or in a critical care role. We are aware of the impact on our families and understand the additional stress this creates for you and are sorry for this. However, none of our teachers make the decision lightly to strike and they are also not paid for the days they are striking.

persuasive writing skills to explain what changes we would make to Westbury-on-Trym if we were asked to remodel it. We thought


