Dear parents and carers,

Our penultimate week of term has been full of celebrations of sport, music and drama, and engineering to name a few as well as celebrating our Yr6 KS2 SATs results. We have more events planned for next week and look forward to enjoying our last week of the school year together.

Yr5's fantastic production of Treasure Island received the longest round of applause from parents I had ever heard which was very well deserved by every child. On Wednesday and Thursday we managed to dodge the rain with a Shine event for Yr2 on the field and our Infant sports day both of which were a resounding success and the children thoroughly enjoyed the challenge and team work. Thank you to all our parents who attended and cheered the children on and to our staff team who made it happen.

The lego engineering team have visited Yr5 this week too and every class has had the opportunity to enjoy a robotics workshop using their engineering skills – they have commented on how ingenious and creative the children have been as well as working so well in their teams.

Our Yr6 SATS results arrived this week as all reading and Maths papers have been marked by external examiners — we know that every child in Yr6 has worked so hard and achieved their very best and we are proud of them all. The children's outcomes reflect their whole school experience since joining us in Reception and we know they are now ready and prepared for the next stage of their school journey,

#### Safeguarding and confidentiality

At Elmlea we are proud of having such a large community of adoptive families - many families have told us that they chose Elmlea specifically because of the support and provisions we offer, not just for the children, but for the parents as well.

Confidentiality around adoption is paramount and it is vital for those families, children and parents alike, to be able to share their stories as and when they feel comfortable and ready, if at all. Adoptive families might have different approach to sharing their stories, these stories are very personal and very important for adoptive families to own in order to protect their children.

As you will know from some of the newsletters earlier in the year, there can also be some very real safeguarding risks around some children who have been adopted. Therefore, it is even more important that information about children who are adopted is not discussed. If knowledge of an adoptive family comes to you from any source other than that family directly sharing it with you, please could you report this to the school, to Lacey Flook and Rob Salisbury who are the Designated Teachers for the Trust. This is so we can then ensure that the family is aware that this knowledge is being discussed openly and support them appropriately, if necessary.

comprehension text this week was especially inspiring as it was from Alistair Humphreys'








