

Year 1 have been in high spirits this week despite some rainy weather. We have been delving deeper in various areas through whole class taught sessions, independent activities and being curious through our continuous pro-

vision activities. In English this week, we were presented with a crime scene where we had to work out what happened through being detectives. We came to the conclusion that the big, bad wolf had paid a visit and blew down some houses - how rude!

We generated adjectives to describe the wolf which we then turned into sentences using capital letters and full stops. In maths, we have explored making number bonds with tens frames and different resources and will now begin to

revise our knowledge of patterns. In PE, we have been continuing with our Team Building unit and loved working as a team with the parachute this week. Have a super weekend Year 1!


Next week we will building our sentence work towards our own story.

In English, children have read 'There's a Snake in My School!' by David Walliams and they have been focusing on the different word classes and creating interesting noun phrases with the help of a thesaurus. In maths, pupils have continued their learning about number and place value, recapping their understanding of inequality signs and remembering that 'the crocodile eats the bigger number'. They have

> also successfully ordered numbers up to 1000 and have discussed strategies to help when dealing with this type of maths challenge.
