



### Sports Premium in our School 2023-2024

The Government has given every primary school funding to develop physical education and competitive sport. This funding is intended for the purposes of establishing and developing sports activities which are sustainable in the long term. The school will receive £19,610 of Sports Premium funding for 2023-2024, in our school we are using this funding to provide:

All children to build relationships with their new class and teacher through team work based OAA activities at Mojo.	£1350	Establishing friendships with others in new classes assists in smooth transitions. Learning how to work as part of a new team and socialise with peers is important when in a new class. Activities based at Mojo will assist this whilst being physically active and having fun. Sport premium funding to cover the cost of transport which keep costs to parents to a minimum. This will help them enjoy tennis lessons within their class games lessons.	Continue to work with Bristol Sport Foundation community project to provide a range of sporting opportunities for SEN children.
Subscriptions to 'Get Set for PE' platform to assist delivery of lessons and assessment of children within PE.	£480	Regular updates of new lesson plans and schemes of learning allow high quality delivery of PE lessons within a broad curriculum of activities. Assessment tools will assist PE lead and class teachers to effectively implement.	As staff become more confident and practices established, resources can be re-used.
