Strictly no nuts OR seeds

The school has a strict no nut or seeds policy as there are members of the school community with severe nut allergies as well as severe, airborne allergies to sesame and flaxseed. Please do **not** send your child into school with **any** nut or seed based items in their packed lunch or snack box.



This includes items such as **pesto pasta**, **chocolate spread**, **cereal bars**, anything with **almond or other nut flavouring**, including cakes eg/ some

Madelaine cakes) and any other products which may contain traces of nuts. It also includes seeded bread and sesame seed buns and also hummus which generally contains tahini (made from sesame seeds). It applies to after school clubs too.

Our aim is to make the school a safe place for all of our students. We very much appreciate your cooperation and understanding as do the families of the children to whom this applies.

We look forward to discussing your child's start at school with you at parents evening. Your child's learning diary will be available for you to look at whilst you wait for your appointment.



KS1 Curriculum evening Tuesday 7th November from 6-7pm



Year 2 have enjoyed Poetry Week and have written some brilliant poems about their treasures. They also learnt about a poet a day and we listened to some funny poems! We have worked hard in maths to fill in

missing numbers on number lines and use part-part whole models to find missing numbers. In science we conducted an ice experiment, can your child tell you what question we were trying to answer? During topic we learnt facts about the polar regions and reminded ourselves about the famous explorers we have studied this term. We designed and painted some great arctic pictures inspired by cool colours. Have a good weekend!



Year 3

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Year 3 have had an action-packed week which has included our play auditions and making a start to learn the songs for our end of term production, 'A Hint of Snow White'. In English, children have focused on upgrading their work and are preparing for their writing progress
