
Reception


**Year 4** - Year 4 have had a great week in Year 4. We have dressed up in odd socks and had a spotty, yellow, fun-filled Friday! In between, we have been busy writing a biography on a person of our choice. We have had to think about the chronological order of their life and what they have achieved in their life too. We have also looked at the biographies of Roald Dahl, JK Rowling and Usain Bolt.



In DT, we have been learning about Food Hygiene and how to prevent the spread of bacteria and infections when cooking. Good work Year 4!

**Year 5** Wow! What a great week we have had in Year 5 this week! In maths, we have been continuing our fractions journey, and finding fractions of amounts alongside converting fractions into decimals. In history, we went back in time to answer the question "Gruesome Greeks or Great Greeks" and looked at some of the punishments that the Ancient Greeks invented. It is fair to say, we were glad that most of them are no longer allowed. In DT, we continued our project on designing a throne for an Ancient Greek god or goddess, and evaluated different products that were out there already. We applied our knowledge of different types of joinery to help us with the eval-



uations. We also have had a lot of fun with chocolate and other solids in science, where we melted different solids and tested to see if they could resolidify. Not eating the chocolate was definitely the hardest part of the lesson! Well done on another fabulous week Year 5! Year 5 Team

**Year 6** This week in year 6 we have continued to explore light. We have changed its direction using reflection and investigated how a mirror works. We understand more about the Ancient Greek Olympics which dominated the Ancient world for over 1000 years and how many practices are still followed today. We also carefully studied some chairs to see what features we might be able to apply to our wooden thrones. In maths, we are deep into our fractions unit and are becoming confident with converting between improper, proper and mixed and finding common denominators which enable us to add and subtract.
