
Year 1 Team



Year 2 had a great No Tech day on Monday and thought hard about the reasons for

doing it. Alongside trying to do normal lessons in less than ideal lighting, we also played some games that the children could take home for their own Earth hour. We looked at the history of travel and how it has changed over time from some of the earliest

In English we have continued our story writing based around the story of the Iron Man which the children have been enthused by.



This has included using conjunctions because we want to improve our writing. In maths we have explored fractions further and looked to find quarters and thirds of shapes and small amounts. In science we began an investigation to find out if seeds would grow in a plastic bag with a wet paper towel. Updates to follow on that one...

In Year 3 this week, pupils have been continuing to try and write descriptive sentences based on the 'Escape from Pompeii' text. Children learnt in more detail about what happened on the day of the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and how archaeologists are still making new discoveries to this day. On 'No Tech Day!' pupils enjoyed our shape drawing competition. Children completed this in their houses and had to draw and cut accurate shapes. The more difficult the shape, the more points were earned. Pupils also explored the Earth Day's theme of 'Planet vs Plastic'







and created A3 posters suggesting ways in which we could try and recycle, reduce and reuse more plastic waste. Well done, Year 3!




Within English, we have continued to look at how to write effective and engaging biographies, with a particular focus on creating cohesion within our writing and complex sentences
